### Local's once in a lifetime African safari — Part I

We turned the corner in the South African Bushveld and a beautiful valley opened before us. A creek running through the middle of the valley was lined with tall majestic eucalyptus trees and a herd of red Impalas was grazing in the winter grasses. We spot a trophy buck with his beautifully curved horns; however, he sees us and bounds away into the brushy cover. We get off the truck and prepare for the stalking hunt.

Less than 24 hours earlier we had landed at the International airport at Johannesburg, South Africa, on a trip that had originated at Dulles Airport near Washington, D.C. This 18 hour trip involved a stop in Dakar, Senegal on the Ivory Coast for fuel.

We were picked up by Van Wijk Safaris (www.vanwijksafaris.com) and transported to the Lodge, which was located in the Waterberg, near the town of Vaalwater in the Province of Limpopo. The Lodge

consists of multiple thatched roof buildings with accommodations for guests and the great hall, which included kitchen, living room and dining area. The walls and floors of these buildings are of stone and tile with very high ceilings, which keeps the buildings cool in the hottest weather. In addition there is a swimming pool, barbecue area, an archery range with a fine view of a large pond.



The pond was covered with lily pads and full of fish and colorful birds of all kinds. In fact the Hadeda Ibis wakes a person at dawn with his loud repeated cries of 'ha-de-da!'

The meals were fabulous and usually consisted of some wild game. We were served scrambled Ostrich eggs for one breakfast (one egg would serve ten people) and there was usually an outdoor fire and barbecue in the evening.

Rita, the cook put it this way, "We love to cook wild game and if you have success in your hunt you will have a variety of meat, if not you certainly will not starve!" Evening meals usually consisted of four or five hot dishes.

Every comfort was available

at the lodge including laundry, room cleaning, wake up calls and great food. Water and soft drinks were also provided on the hunt.

It is now winter in South Africa; however, the weather was always sunny with the temps ranging from 30s and 40s at night to highs in the 70s although one day it got to a high of near 90.

A mascot of the lodge was an ostrich that loved to strut around and show off for people. It certainly liked any scraps that it could get and if you could find one of her eggs, you got ostrich scrambled

It was interesting to note that there was a 70 foot steel pole erected near the buildings. This is a lightening rod designed to attract lightening from the summer storms and protect the thatched roofs from fire.

We had the opportunity to ride on wild trained elephants. The ride was about an hour long and took place on a game farm. We saw rhinoceros, wildebeest and many other animals and birds on the ride. The elephants would stop and break off the top of a tree, sometimes 4 inches in diameter and chew the leaves and wood. Later we had lunch and were amused when a monkey ran over and drank a grandson's pop when he wasn't watching. A little goat chewed on us and did tricks. We also got to see a baby white lion being cared for in a basket.

### The Northern Mockingbird

The Northern Mockingbird was discovered over 250 years ago by Mark Catesby, an Englishman and founder of American Ornithology, who called it the "Mock-Bird of Carolina." American Indians called it centcontlatolly which means "four hundred tongues" or hush-balbaka which means "bird that speaks foreign language".

The Northern Mockingbird has been praised from the time of its first discovery for its marvelous voice and mimicking abilities. John James Audubon wrote that "the Nightingale would have to study under Mozart to in time, become interesting... But to compare her to the Mockingbird, is... quite absurd." Naturalist John Burroughs added that the Mockingbird was like "the Lark and the Nightingale in one." From "Nature Lovers' Library", Edward Howe Forbush wrote about the song, saying "the Mockingbird stands unrivaled. He is the king of song."

is between nine to 11 inches long, making it about the size of a Robin but slimmer. The sexes appear outwardly alike, medium gray above and grayish white below. They have a long tail with white outer tail feathers and white wing patches. They have dark legs, feet and bills and they have yellow eyes. Their normal call notes are either "chair" or "tchack". He sings strong musical variations of these songs by day and by night, a famed mimic and singer on moonlit nights, in country gardens, shrubs in towns and the edges of woods. They are found throughout the central and southern parts of the United States. Their scientific name is "mimus polyglottos" which means "many tongued" or "mimic of many tongues". This celebrated "King of Song" mimics frogs, crickets and at least 50 different bird calls.

The Northern Mockingbird

The Northern Mockingbird is the state bird of five different states – Florida, Arkansas,

Mississippi, Tennessee and Texas, second only to the seven states of the Cardinal. Texas chose the Northern Mockingbird for its state bird because they wanted "a fighter for the protection of his home, falling, if need be, in its defense, like any true Texan".

The Northern Mockingbird is listed as a rare regular spring and fall migrant and possible nester in Minnesota. Of the three members of the mockingbird family found in Minnesota, it is the rarest - the other two species are the Gray Catbird and the Brown Thrasher. They winter in the southern United States, Mexico and Central America. Most spring reports are from April and May, most fall reports are from August, September and October. There are very few nesting records for Minnesota. A pair nested in Royalton in Morrison County in both 1968 and 1969 and a pair nested at Blue Mounds State Park in Rock County in 1977. The

nest is built by both parent birds in the fork or branch of a spruce, cedar or arborvitae. It is made up of twigs, leaves, string and grasses. The female lays four or five greenish eggs, speckled brown. They are known for fiercely guarding their nests, chasing anything that comes close, not hesitating to attack any size threat, including humans - this can be hard on some people, since they often nest in backyards. The female does all the incubating, the male defending the nest and feeds her at the nest. The eggs hatch out in about 12 days and the young fledge out in another 12 days.

When foraging for food on the ground, they are known for raising and flapping their wings to flush insects for their prey. They feed on grasshoppers, ants, beetles, flies, mosquitoes, caterpillars and moths. It is estimated that about 43% of their diet is fruit, elderberries, blackberries, grapes and the berries of red cedars.

They were once called the supreme effort, he slowly

They were once called the Mimic Thrush. There is a record of a Northern Mockingbird joining the National Symphony Orchestra during an outdoor concert in Washington, D. C., mimicking the flute which imitated the bird calls in "Peter and the Wolf." He got rave reviews, a real success.

Edward Howe Forbush wrote "The singer flutters into the air from some tall tree-top and improvises his music, pouring out all the power and energy of his being in such an ecstasy of the song that, exhausted his strength in

floats on quivering, beating pinions down through the bloom-covered branches until, his fervor spent, he sinks to the ground below."

Probably my favorite quote comes from "To Kill a Mockingbird", the marvelous 1960 novel by Harper Lee. The children are given an air rifle, shown how to safely use it and are warned never to shoot a mockingbird because they "don't do one thing but sing their hearts out for us. That's why it's a sin to kill a mockingbird." Truer words have never been written!

### Bird die-off disease strain identified



A virulent strain of New-castle Disease is responsible for the death of nearly 1,000 gulls and 500 cormorants in Minnesota this summer.

The specific strain of Newcastle Disease was confirmed this week by the National Wildlife Health Center in Madison, WI.

The practical implica-

Minnesota poultry producers should practice sound biosecurity procedures, including the monitoring of their poultry flocks for signs of illness and taking steps to prevent wild birds from having contact with their flocks.

Newcastle Disease has not yet been detected in Minnesota's poultry flocks. If birds show clinical signs suggestive of this disease, producers should immediately contact their veterinarian or the Board of Animal Health at 320-231-5170. Similarly, cormorants, gulls and pelicans suspected to have the disease should be reported to the local Department of Natural Resources (DNR) area wildlife office.

Cormorant and gull dieoff occurred earlier this summer on Marsh Lake in Big Stone County and Wells Lake in Rice County and in recent days sick and dead cormorants have been discovered at Leech Lake in Cass County. Additionally, the National Wildlife Health Center is conducting tests on dead cormorants, gulls and pelicans collected from Lake Vermillion and Lake of the Woods. To date, all dead birds have tested negative for the avian influenza

A viral avian disease, Newcastle rarely affects humans. When it does affect humans it generally causes a relatively mild pink eye.

Newcastle Disease is not new to Minnesota. The last virulent outbreak of this disease occurred in 2008, when about 2,400 birds died at eight different locations. State officials ensure that dead birds are buried or incinerated.





# Surplus fall wild turkey licenses available



Leftover permits will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Surplus fall turkey licenses also will be also be available online at noon on Sept. 13.

Until noon on Sept. 20, hunters who were not chosen in the fall turkey permit lottery may purchase a surplus license. After noon on Sept. 20, people who did

not apply in the lottery may purchase a license.

Because hunting access in many zones is limited, hunters should obtain landowner permission before purchasing a leftover permit. For 2010, the fall hunt has been changed to a single 30-day season running from Sat., Oct., 2, to Sun., Oct. 31.

Hunters may check the availability of leftover licenses or the status of their lottery applications on the DNR website at mndnr. gov/hunting/turkey.

# **Two Republican Governors** reject new sex ed program, apply for abstinence funds

Republican Govs. Bob McDonnell of Virginia and Tim Pawlenty of Minnesota applied for abstinence-education funding on Aug. 30 – just meeting U. S. Department of Health and Human Services' deadline.

The U.S. Congress and the administration had canceled all abstinencecentered program grants for the FY2010 budget, putting at risk more than 2 million students who are expected to attend 176 abstinence programs this fall.

I went to her bank to get money out of her account to pay for her funeral, and the bank would not allow me to do so. They said that the power of attorney is automatically void upon my mother's death. How can I get the money out of my mother's bank account to pay the funeral bill? I certainly do not have the money to pay out of my pocket, and all the rest of the family has either already passed away or cannot afford to pay for it either. I want to honor my mother's wishes and have her buried the way she wished.

**DEAR ALAN:** 

Please accept my condolences. The bank is correct. A financial power of attorney is automatically terminated upon the principal's death. People in Minnesota have the option to have one or

**DEAR SENIOR LEGAL** both types of financial powers of attorney: the common law power of attorney or the Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney. Most people have the Statutory Short Form Power of Attorney. The Statutory Short Form can be found in Minnesota Statutes

Chapter 523. Under Minnesota Statutes Section 523.08, the power of attorney will terminate on the earliest of the following: the death of the principal, the expiration date specified in the power of attorney, or, in the case of a power of attorney to the spouse of the principal, upon the start of divorce, separation, or annulment proceedings of the principal's marriage. Also, unless the power of attorney is "durable", it will also terminate when the principal is incapacitated. Minnesota Statutes § 523.09. Further, the principal can terminate the power of attorney by revoking it in writing. Minnesota Statutes § 523.11.

Since your mother passed away, the power of attorney has terminated. Since the power of attorney is terminated, you have no authority via the power of attorney to gain access to your mother's bank account. So, how can you gain access to your mother's bank account to pay for her funeral?

First, let's get this out of the way children and non-spouses are not legally responsible to pay for the funeral of their parent or other relative. As much as you may feel obligated to do so morally, you do not have to pay for your parent's funeral. If you sign a funeral contract, you become responsible to pay the bill. Do not sign anything that you do not understand, agree with, and can afford. Under Minnesota law, if a person dies without the means to pay for their funeral or final disposition, the county will provide for it (after investigating if there is a prepaid funeral plan or a spouse that can pay). Minnesota Statutes § 261.035. The county will not provide for anywhere near an elaborate funeral, so families do sometimes choose to pay for a more elaborate funeral for

Second, once you do gain access to your mother's money, you must be careful about how you spend her estate. Minnesota law has a hierarchy of priority debts and claims to be paid out of a deceased person's estate. Minnesota Statutes § 524.3-805. The first debts to be paid are the costs and expenses of administrating the estate (if any). The second debts to be paid are your mother's reasonable funeral expenses. Third, are debts and taxes under federal law. Fourth are the reasonable and necessary medical, hospital, or nursing home expenses of the last illness of your mother (including Medical Assistance claims). Fifth are the same as the fourth except it is for the expenses during the year preceding her death. Sixth are debts with preference under Minnesota law and state taxes; and finally seventh, all other debts. You can see that the legislature placed funeral expenses almost at the top of the hierarchy, so it is very important that your mother's assets (e.g. her bank account) be used to pay for the funeral, if there are no administration expenses.

I am assuming that your mother did not have a prepaid burial contract or life her funeral. If you are not a co-owner or beneficiary of your mother's bank accounts, you won't have immediate access to your mother's account. If your mother did not own real estate in her name only and all of her titled personal property totals less than \$50,000, then it may be possible for you as her "successor-in-interest" to collect the title to the bank accounts into your name through an "Affidavit for Collection of Personal Property". Minnesota Statutes § 524.3-1201. To use this method, besides the two conditions above, there must not be any pending probate proceeding and 30 days must have elapsed since her death. You may obtain the affidavit form from the Minnesota Courts website at www.mncourts. gov or by going to your local courthouse. Once you fill it out, you must sign it in front of a notary public and take it to the titleholder of the personal property, in this case the bank. Keep a copy for your records. The bank should then transfer title of the bank accounts into your

insurance policy to pay for

This will take at least 30 days, so there may be a delay in having the funeral. Perhaps the funeral home would agree to do the funeral sooner based on your mother's latest bank statement, showing enough money to pay for a funeral. There would be even further delay if the deceased person needed to probate their estate – for example, if they owned real estate in their name only or had more than \$50,000 in titled personal property (that didn't pass automatically to a joint owner or a beneficiary). Thus, in order to avoid delay and uncertainty, if affordable, it is better to prepay for a funeral. Unfortunately this won't help you, Alan, but perhaps others can better prepare based on your experience.

### Reliable production records for SURE

For the SURE (Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program) also known as the disaster program, reliable records are records that a producer keeps track of on a yearly basis and are used in the SURE application to prove production records when verifiable records, such as sales receipts, are not available.

For the 2008 SURE signup and for future sign-ups, producers are required to provide at least two years of production records besides the crop year they are making application for. If producers

can show that they are keeping track of their production on a consistent basis by writing production down on diaries, calendars, etc., then the County Committee can use reliable records to verify production in their 2008 and future SURE applications.

It is very important for producers to keep track of their yearly production for crops where verifiable records are not available; the most common crop where reliable records would apply is on hay production. Producers that had the buy-in on crops

(crops that they did not purchase crop insurance or NAP coverage for in 2008) will also be required to show that they are keeping track of their production on a yearly basis, an example of that would be keeping track of the number of truck loads that are put in the bin.

## **Bullhead transport restricted north** of Minnesota Highway 210

Anglers can use bullheads up to 10 inches long, as live bait but those baitfish cannot be transported north of Minnesota Highway 210, according to a rule change adopted by the Minnesota Department of Resources

The new rule, which went into effect Aug. 9, allows catfish anglers to use larger bullheads as bait yet helps prevent non-native bullhead populations from establishing themselves in additional northern Minnesota lakes.

The previous rule allowed anglers to use bullheads up to seven inches long as bait because that size is defined as minnows. Those fish could be captured from noninfested waters via dip net, angling or non-commercial seine and transported live

cies. The old rule allowing transport north of Minnesota Highway 210 increased the possibility that non-native bullhead populations could be established in additional

The new rule allows bullheads to be taken using dip nets, non-commercial nets and angling by a person with a valid fishing license. Any fish bullheads greater than seven inches and up to and including 10 inches taken are considered part of the angler's possession limit of bullheads.

Bullheads up to and including 10 inches cannot be taken from designated infested waters and used

for bait (unless designated solely because they contain Eurasian water milfoil). Bullheads up to and including 10 inches taken from non-infested waters for use as bait may only be transported in portable bait containers.

An additional rule change allows live transportation and possession of white suckers 12 inches and longer that can be now be used for bait. People possessing and transporting white suckers are required to purchase such fish from a licensed commercial vendor and retain a receipt snowing the date and time of purchase. White suckers that have been taken by the angler may not be transported live and then used for bait.

The spark started two years ago in McGregor, when a group of parents traveled to various schools in the area


along with their kids and Tball team. In visiting the other playgrounds, the parents came to realize how antiquated McGregor's school/community playground equipment was.
