Prominent Aitkin lawyer, hospital board chair, Mike Ryan, dies Ryan was an outstanding and memorable citizen of Aitkin



Known for his quick wit and boundless energy well past the age when most people retire, Mike Ryan, longtime Aitkin attorney and chair of the Riverwood Healthcare Center Board, died on Sept. 7.

Ryan, 75, grew up in Aitkin as part of a large Irish and German Catholic family. The son of Caroline (Hassman) and Joe Ryan, he was one of six children who grew up in the stately white co-Ionial home in southeast Aitkin.

Ryan later occupied Ryan's Farm in southeast Aitkin, a farm that was literally in town, where he kept horses and cows. Previously it was the Foley Farm. He was known to pay Christmas Eve calls with his horse and sleigh and has a horse buried under the big oak tree at the entrance to Riverwood

Healthcare Center. He was married to Judy (Cummings) and they have five children. He was very devoted to his family and St. James Catholic Church.

The farmland where Mike spent many years ended up being the site of Riverwood

Healthcare Center, the Aitkin Ironworks, the North Ambulance office and another large office building now occupied by Riverwood. There are plans to build a new Congregational Church on the site.

Ryan was devoted to Riverwood Healthcare Center, where he served as chair of the board of directors.

The local hospital released this memory of Mike:

"Under Mike Ryan's leadership on the Riverwood board, the number of family practice and internal medicine practitioners grew from five in 1991 to 20 in 2009. During this same time period, the number of surgeons and specialty physicians and practitioners has grown substantially, from three to 35. Ryan helped guide strategic planning for the future in

terms of facility needs of the hospital and clinics as well. He was instrumental in building board consensus to move ahead with a \$20-million integrated hospital and clinic facility, which opened in 2003. He oversaw expansion of Riverwood's McGregor clinic and specialty clinic in Aitkin in 2006 and the opening of a new full-service medical clinic and pharmacy in Garrison in 2007. During the past year, Ryan's board leadership included planning for a \$21 million expansion project for Riverwood with construction tentatively set to begin in spring 2011 and completion of the project by Fall 2012. The renovation will add more than 70,000 square feet and include the creation of 25 all private, single hospital patient rooms plus more emergency care rooms."

"Over the past nine years, Mike was a pleasure to work with in his board chairman role because he kept the board focused on true governance issues and procedures, leaving the operations decisions to our management team," said Mike Hagen, Riverwood CEO. " He demonstrated a real curiosity for how things were working for our health system and asked good questions to ensure the board understood all the issues our employees and medical staff were facing. Mike was a strong supporter of strategic planning and provided valuable input on many issues including quality, financial and physician initiatives. He was always thoughtful in his analysis and skilled at obtaining consensus from board members. Continued on Page 2

His leadership and guidance will continue to be felt as Riverwood continues on the path that Mike has helped us visualize and develop over the years."

Ryan was very successful in his law career. He practiced law in the areas of corporate; business; real estate; estate planning; Probate; Personal Injury; Utilities; Municipal. He attended Maryhill Academy in Aitkin and St. John's Prep School in Collegeville. He graduated from St. John's University in 1957 and William Mitchell College of Law in 1962. He was admitted to the bar in Minnesota in 1963 and to the United States District Court in 1968. He served as a law Clerk to Honorable Edward J. Devitt, Chief Judge, U.S. District Court, District of Minnesota, 1962.


Mike Ryan was the unique combination of country law-

yer and visionary thinker who helps to shape the spirits of small towns. His law office, where he once practiced with his father, sits on the stoplight corner in Aitkin. They used to occupy the upstairs and in recent years moved to downstairs quarters alongside the Aitkin County License Center. The upstairs is now apartments and Mike practiced law with Henry Brucher and never retired.

Local's once in a lifetime African safari — Part II

This is the second installment about my August trip to the Limpopo Province of South Africa.

It was a beautiful clear sunshiny day with temps in the 60s. We were in a blind overlooking a large pond set in the red African soil. We were there for warthogs and there were lots of little pigs around. It won't be long before a big one appears, we thought, as we read our books.

There was only one prob-

lem; this game farm contained

hundreds of cattle as well

as game animals and all of

these cows loved that pond.

They were actually wading

out in the pond, getting their

drinks and then lying down,

right where the big one was

> The Waterberg is an area in Limpopo that is about 40 square miles. The mountains bluffs, buttes and Bushveld are made up of porous sandstone, which can hold large quantities of water. In fact during the 19th century the area was so wet that the people planted eucalyptus trees to suck up the water. Recently the area has been very dry and farmers are cutting down all of these

eucalyptus trees. The sandstone formations have wonderful color that reflects in the sunlight and is especially beautiful at sunset. All of the trees seem to be very crooked. It is possible that giraffes and elephants may be responsible

as they love to eat the tops of trees. Unusual trees are the Cabbage tree, which has no cabbage; the silver cluster leaf tree which smells like bread baking; and the lekkerbreek tree, which makes a loud snapping sound when it breaks; the piney leaf monkey orange tree, which provides fruit

that may be eaten but is often dried and carved as souvenirs.

One interesting bit of African history was the way that the Dutch settled this land. They were called Voortreckkers and they set out with family

and traveled in a difficult land that provided many dangers.

One such group was called the Jerusalem Gangers. These folks did not like the English who lived around Cape Town. They considered them to be the Anti-Christ and decided that they would travel north through Africa until they got to Israel by using maps from the back of their Bibles. When they got to the area of the Limpopo they saw a rock formation that looked like a pyramid. They believed that they were in Egypt (Actually they were over five thousand miles from there). They found a river, considered it the source of the Nile and name it the Nyl. That was the end of



Billionaire Soros donates \$100 million to anti-family, anti-faith group

Billionaire liberal activist George Soros announced today that he plans to donate \$100 million to Human Rights Watch (HRW) – a "non-partisan, watch dog" organization that purports to alert the United Nations on human rights abuses. HRW, however, is better known for demanding the closure of Guantanamo Bay and civilian trials for its detainees.

Soros said his intention was to transform the organization into an international force by expanding its presence in "emerging power centers," including Brazil, Mexico, India and China.

Soros has long sought to undermine domestic and foreign policies – everything from marriage and life to U.S. support for Israel - through his active funding of counter-cultural groups including: Catholics in Alliance for the Common Good (pro-abortion), EMILY's List (pro-abortion), National Organization for Women (NOW), Planned Parenthood (pro-abortion), Moveon.org,

Democracy Alliance (progressive grassroots organization), Human Rights Campaign (pro-GLBT agenda), Open Society Institute (promotes "sex workers" rights, drug legalization, euthanasia, etc.), Earth Institute ("Green" agenda), the Center for American Progress (Think-tank for Obama Administration), Media Matters, and the Service Employees International Union (SEIU).

In an interview with The New York Times, Soros' long-standing hatred for all that the Bush administration represented seemed still fresh:

"I'm afraid the United States has lost the moral high ground under the Bush administration, but the principles that Human Rights Watch promotes have not lost their universal applicability," he said. "So to be more effective, I think the organization has to be seen as more international, less an American organization."

This is the first in a series of large financial gifts Soros plans to make – and he has the resources to do so. In the last eight months, Soros' company, Quantum Endowment, profited greatly from the financial market chaos -and earned him \$3.3 billion in fees and profits.

Interestingly, not every liberal is pleased with the donation. Liberal lawyer and author Alan Dershowitz wrote on his blog:

"Who is watching Human Rights Watch, one of the world's best-financed and most influential human rights organizations? It turns out that they cook the books about facts, cheat on interviews, and put out pre-determined conclusions that are driven more by their ideology than by evidence. These are serious accusations, and they are demonstrably true.

"Human Rights Watch no longer deserves the support of real human rights advocates. Nor should its so-called reporting be credited by objective news organizations."




